Brief CIS Program Report	Coordinator Kokoska gave a brief update on the CIS program. She highlighted the changes that were underway for the CIS program based on recommendations of the Program Advisory Board at the last meeting. • CIS220 Hardware and Software was removed from the core • CIS303 Management Information Systems was removed from the core (The courses were not eliminated – they may be offered on a more limited basis) • CIS221 Unix was added to the core • CIS110 Computer Fundamentals was added to the core A lively discussion around program offerings, soft skills, etc. followed. Update on the Shared Security Degree	Dr. Henry Felch updated the Board on the status of the Shared Cyber-Security degree, the progress of the degree, and plans for implementation.	
Virtualization Labs	Dr. Henry Felch explained to the Board how virtualization was being used to provide hands-on labs for students in CIS. He described our two environments – the VMWare instance and the Advanced Computing Group at Orono. Dr. Felch mentioned the outdated hardware for our VMWare instance and possible options.	
Mainely Tech Women	Coordinator Kokoska described the newly formed Mainely Tech Women Committee, an outgrowth of the System Student Success Committee. The Mission is to "promote educational, networking, career, and collegial opportunities for girls and young women in Maine sparked by technology." Any interested women were invited to join.
